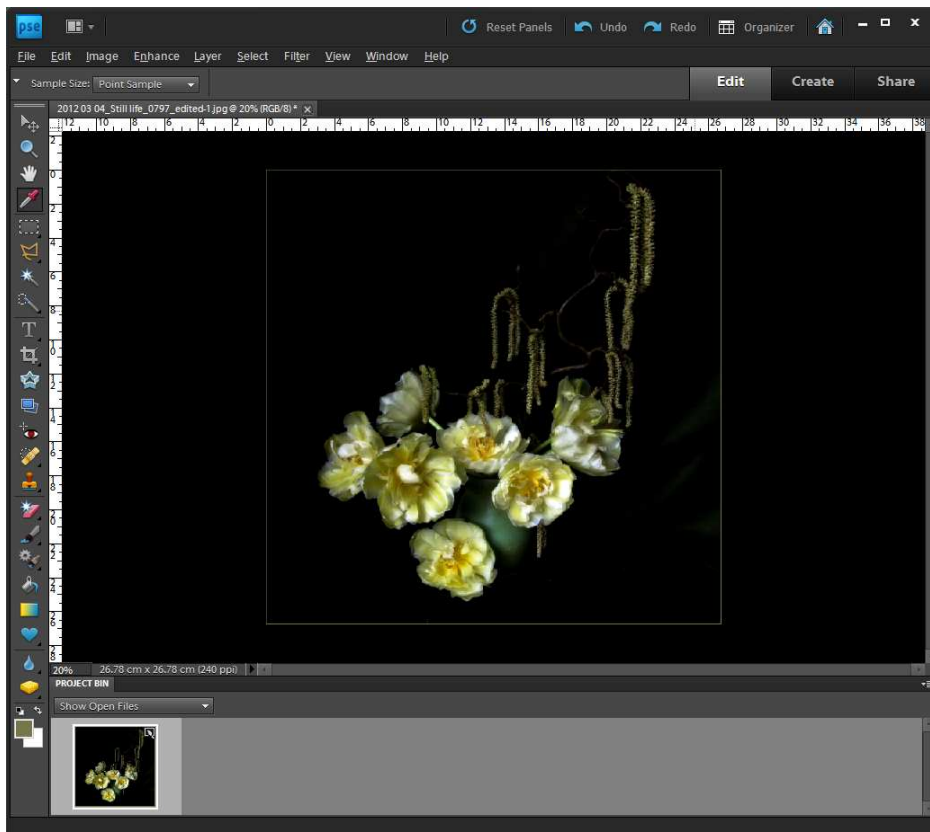
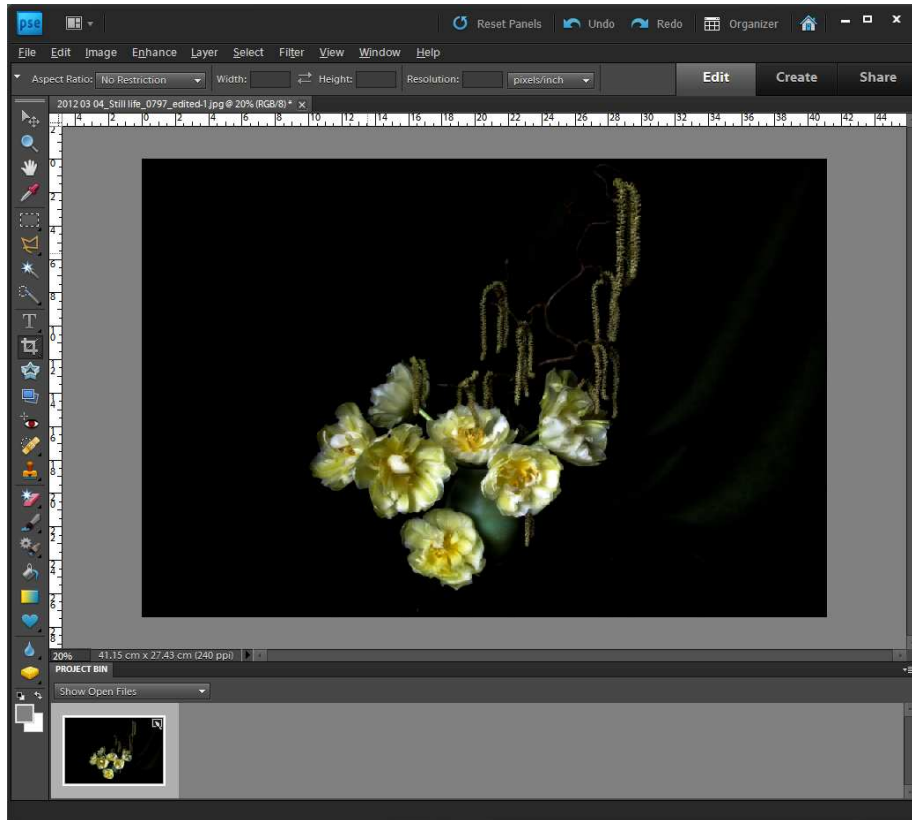
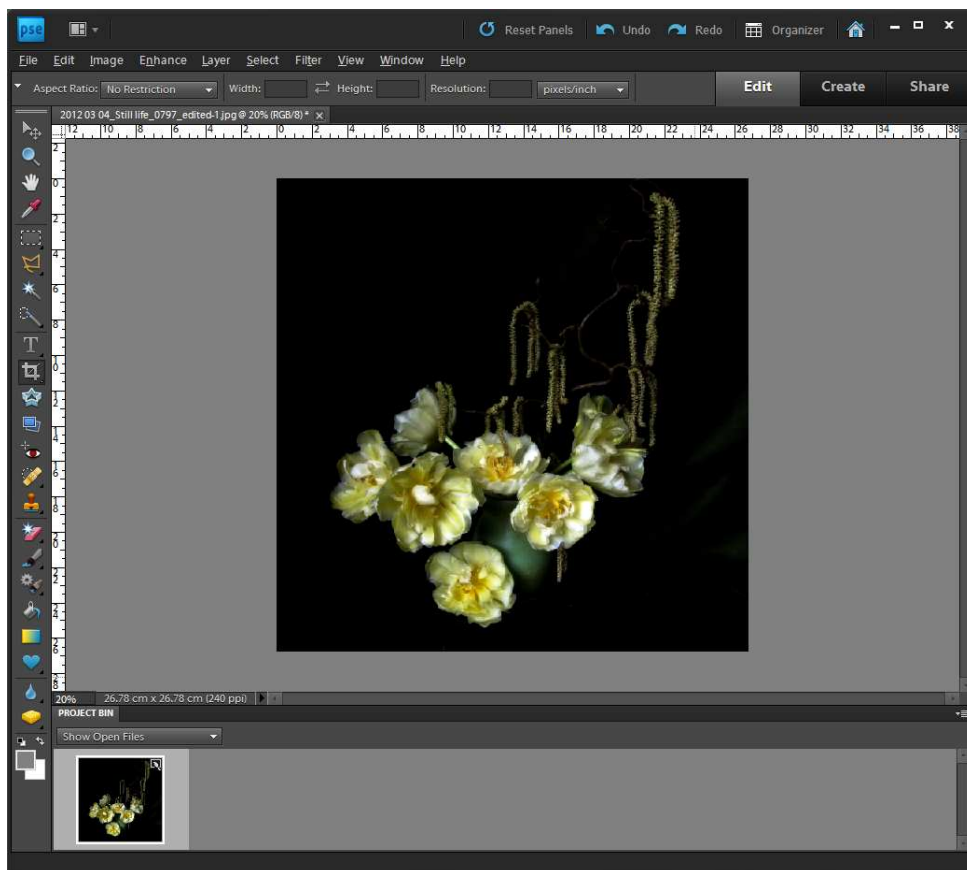
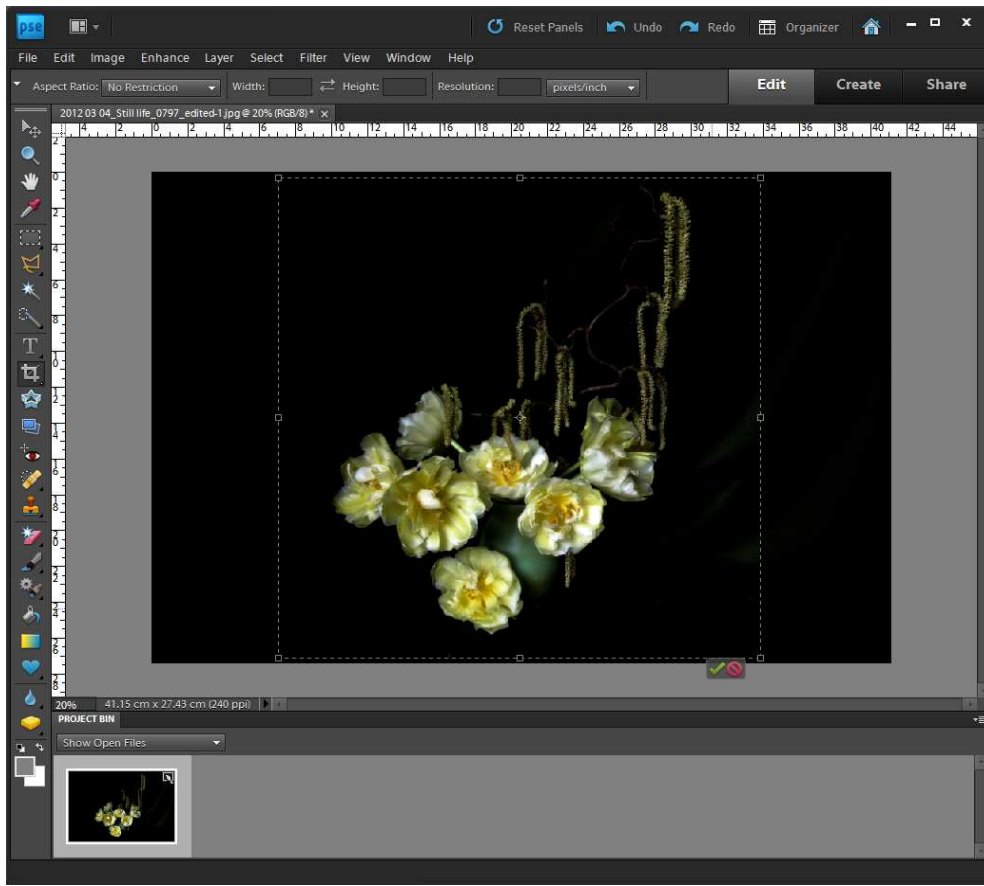


How to add a stroke or keyline around an image

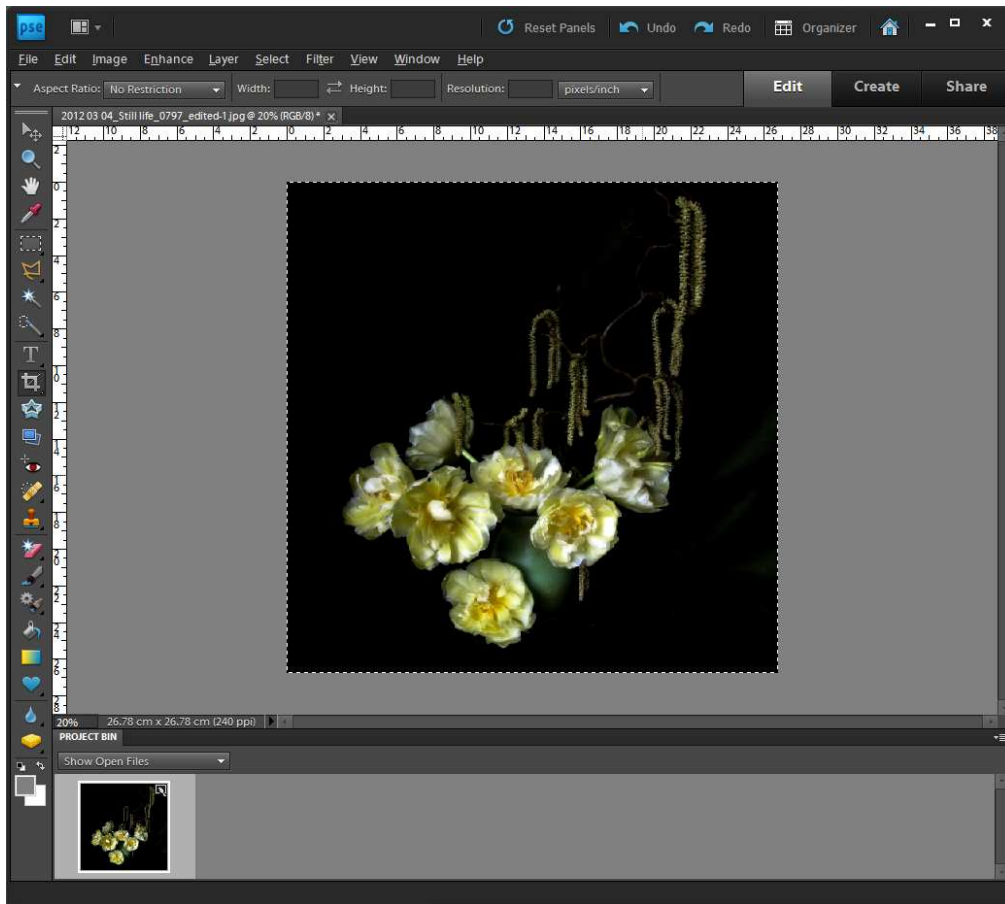
If your image has a very dark area at the edges it is a good idea to use a stroke to make it stand out from the background when projected.



Select crop tool and crop to desired shape.

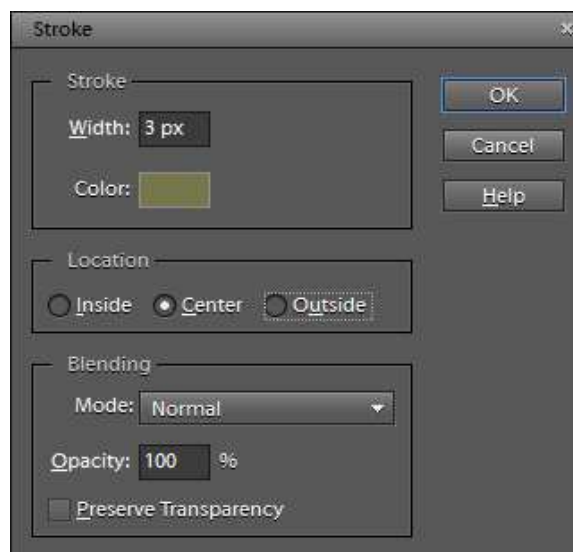


Use Ctrl and A to select your image (this will put the “marching ants” around the edges)



Rather than using white for the stroke it will sometimes look better if you have selected a colour from your picture instead.

You can use the eyedropper tool to select a colour by selecting the eyedropper and then clicking on the colour you want. When you click on Edit and select Stroke (Outline) Selection you will see the colour you have selected. This colour has been selected from the lighter part of the catkins



Click OK to put the stroke around your image. Unless you have put a thick stroke around the image it will not show. Right click in the grey area to bring up the option to change background colour to black and you will then be able to see the stroke.
